- Please comment on the importance of this training opportunity and the specific benefits for your country/region.
- What long-term impacts and achievements can you link to your fellowship? (e.g. the impact it had on your career development and leadership skills, on other members of your institution (did you organize training workshops? Did you encourage others to apply for fellowships themselves? Have you hosted fellows yourself?), on your capacity to network and fundraise etc.)
- What tangible results were achieved from your fellowship visit and did they lead to a long-term collaboration with your host supervisor?
